Remarks from our Co-Chairs

Congressman Meeks shared concerns about the danger our country is in. For the first time, America is seen as alone instead of first because our adversaries look like our allies and our allies look like our adversaries. He celebrated being in person at the Edward Davis Center to see Rev. Davis's dream of housing and community development being fulfilled.

The JFK Redevelopment has been through a lot of ups and down since COVID with a lot of unknowns. Through the tough times, the work continued behind the scenes with the PANYNJ and the Terminal Developers to make it to this point. He acknowledged RF Wilkins, Crescent Consultants, Rachelle Antoine, Akshar Patel and the entire Community Advisory Council for their efforts. He warned the community that challenging days may be ahead again because of implications with this administration. This can be seen with 401K decreases and costs going up for business. This administration promised to fix the economy and inflation rates and economy on "Day 1" but now job creation is moving towards being worse than great depression. Despite the potential challenges ahead, Congressman Meeks pledged to make sure JFK is remodeled as the greatest example of a modern airport in the world. He applauded the Governor's Office for making a commitment to make sure people has access to capital for this project and hinted about an upcoming announcement.

Congressman Meeks closed with his gratitude to be present with his constituents after a tough week in Washington DC. As he travels, walking through the terminals he is excited to see the transformation. While there is more work to do, with collaborative effort we will succeed. He reminded everyone to come prepared to compete for these opportunities and so that as co-chairs, they can advocate for more opportunities. He introduced his new staff member Maxwell Rose and closed with *"Power comes from the people. I will have your back with the PANYNJ & I will have your back in DC. The United States of America is the best county in the world, NYC is the best city in the State and Queens is best community ever led by our Borough President Donovan Richards!"*

Borough President Richards thanked Congressman Meeks and applauded how he fights for the interests of his constituents at home and in DC. He also thanked the PANYNJ and the Terminal Developers for their continued work and highlighted the recent Terminal 5 event.

The Borough President also shared the unemployment rate is down in Queens from 24% in 2020 to now 4.8%, the lowest in the city due to projects like redevelopments like LGA & JFK . With 2 Billion dollars going towards Queens based businesses, there has been significant opportunities which include concessions at the airport. Travelers will get a true taste of Queens. He cautioned that while DEI is under attack, we are going to hold PANYNJ to their commitment to MWBE participation and procurement goals. He defined DEI as “Definitely Earned It”. He also acknowledged the Governor’s Office for working to get businesses access to capital.

He also highlighted other exciting news in the Borough like building the first soccer stadium in the city with the same goals for local hiring and MWBEs. Outreach and information sessions are continuing to be held at Borough Hall. Other projects include the Interborough Express (IBX) light rail to connect Bay Ridge, Brooklyn to Jackson Heights, Queens, and the Borough Based Jails; with rehabilitation and create economic opportunities for those impacted by criminal justice system.

He reminded the audience and Advisory Council that we need to ambassadors of this project to ensure everyone has an opportunity to compete on these projects.

The BP closed with great pride in celebrating that Queens is the most diverse county in the United States and we will continue to create opportunities and “get the money”.






JFK Redevelopment | Simplified Roadways & CTA Access


JFK Redevelopment | Westbound Connector



Activation: December 2025

Impacts:

- Westbound Connector will provide access to and T4 from the JFK Expy and eastern points
- Enables bifurcation of airport
- J33 bridge will carry traffic from JFK Expy to Westbound Connector
- J34 bridge will carry traffic from Westbound Connector across the Van Wyck Expy and Federal Circle
 - › Traffic will then merge onto the Van Wyck Expy to access the CTA







The Terminal 4 Phase 2.5 expansion program is complete



Highlights

1. Construction commenced in December 2021
2. 10 new domestic gates added to an extended Concourse A, which allowed Delta to consolidate into Terminal 4 in January 2023
3. 2 new airside lounges
4. Improved capacity at the security check points, gate holdrooms and baggage claim areas
5. In total, approximately 200,000 SF of new terminal space was added to the existing terminal with very little impact to customer experience
6. Met & exceeded goals for diversity contract awards with Delta tracking 39.6% MWBE (vs goal of 30%) and 12.6% Zones 1 & 2 (vs a goal of 10%) participation.


The Terminal 4 Transformation works are well underway

The Terminal 4 Transformation is a component of the Terminal 4 Expansion and Redevelopment program. This program, at \$154m is the basis for Terminal enhancements which will optimize areas of the Terminal wholistically. **These elements focus on People, Processes, Place and Technology.**

Together with the Delta Redevelopment and expansion, the Terminal Transformation program is an integral part of the overall Airport Vision Plan of transforming JFK into a World Class airport. Areas of Transformation have been fundamentally prioritized within the \$1.5b Terminal 4 Expansion plan to match this vision.








Vilson "Vinny" Dautaj

His **current operation at the TWA Hotel** provides a great F&B experience, on a small footprint similar the proposed kiosk program. He participates in numerous Queens, Li, and PANYNJ outreach and charity events.

Food & Beverage Kiosk program



Capex Investment: JFKIAT is investing ~\$2M to create 5 Kiosks spaces that can increase F&B capacity on CCA & bring local brands into the terminal at a lower-barrier to entry.

Local Artwork: Graphical work designed by **Cyan Daly** – a NYC based freelance illustrator. Graphics are inspired by Brooklyn's brownstone houses and the borough's local vibe.

Looking Ahead: In 2025, JFKIAT will partner with Vinny to lead outreach, agreements and operation of three additional local brands/concepts under his mentorship.

In 2024 JFKIAT issued a Food & Beverage RFP and awarded 9 locations in a strong bid from HMS Host, delivering local and NY native brands



JFKIAT OBJECTIVES:

1. Create meaningful investment and provide mentorship for local, small and minority owned businesses
2. Bring new local brands and concepts to T4 that reflect the NY and Queens community
3. Increase and enhance our F&B offerings with dietarily diverse offerings
4. Contribute to the NY sense of place at T4 through localized design concepts

HMS HOST BID KEY COMPONENTS:

- Eight brands that are local to New York or have a strong connection to the city
- A rotating concepts of emerging chefs with NY based James Beard Foundation; Due Madri will be initial concept for 2 years




Five Queens based Retail Concepts throughout T4




T4 Restroom Artwork Integration Program







Attendees were able to network, pitch their businesses, and explore joint ventures and supplier opportunities. The event also provided insights into T4's upcoming commercial program and ACDBE certification guidance from the Port Authority of NY & NJ.

Realterm JFK Development Project Status

- 347,000 square foot air cargo development with 3 accompanying Group VI aircraft ramp positions targeting LEED Silver in JFK's Cargo Area D. The facility is fully leased to Worldwide Flight Services, Inc. (WFS).
- Development was substantially completed in December 2024 and operations commenced shortly after in January of this year. A ceremonial ribbon-cutting is expected this spring and CAC will be invited to attend.
- The facility is equipped with over 30 internal and external electric vehicle and equipment chargers to mitigate emissions, enabling the tenant to migrate to Zero Emissions GSE throughout the facility.
- Development is expected to employ approximately 400 full-time equivalent jobs within the first 3 years of operations. WFS, the main user of the site, is a ground handler who continuously advertises its opportunities in local publications. Operations within the Air Cargo Facility

- Centralized ETV system capable of holding over 200-unit load devices increasing the efficiency of the facility.
- Over 3,000 square feet of climate-controlled facility space for perishables and pharmaceuticals.
- Electric chargers installed throughout the development for forklifts and vehicles.
- User plans to utilize the latest innovations including a Dock Management System, Warehouse Progress Monitoring, Auto Dimensioning Equipment, and Unit Load Device Management Systems.
- Increases the user's cargo handling capacity at the airport by 25%.



Development Lessons Learned

Throughout the life of this project the Realterm and VRH Teams have attended and hosted countless outreach events, where we have had the privilege of meeting hundreds of potential MWBE firms, many of whom we have had the pleasure of engaging in this project. Furthermore, throughout this process we were able to identify many of the challenges that these firms faced. While we have bridged the gap with our partners on many of these challenges, we acknowledge that they exist and remain committed to the program utilizing the lessons learned as a guideline.

1) Stronger Community and Industry Relationships

- Partnering with MWBEs helps build relationships with diverse business owners, fostering long-term partnerships that can lead to future collaborations throughout or respective portfolios. While every MWBE Subcontractor may not have received an opportunity on this project, both Realterm and VRH will continue this commitment to the program by continued engagement and to qualify subcontractors within the JFK Redevelopment program footprint.

2) Access to Unique Expertise & Innovation

- We have learned that many MWBEs bring specialized skills, niche market knowledge, and innovative approaches that add value to projects. Their diverse perspectives can contribute to creative problem-solving and better project outcomes.
- Working with MWBEs helps businesses tap into new markets and expand their professional networks.
- MWBEs often have strong local connections and insights that can open doors to additional opportunities.

3) Commitment to Equity & Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR)


